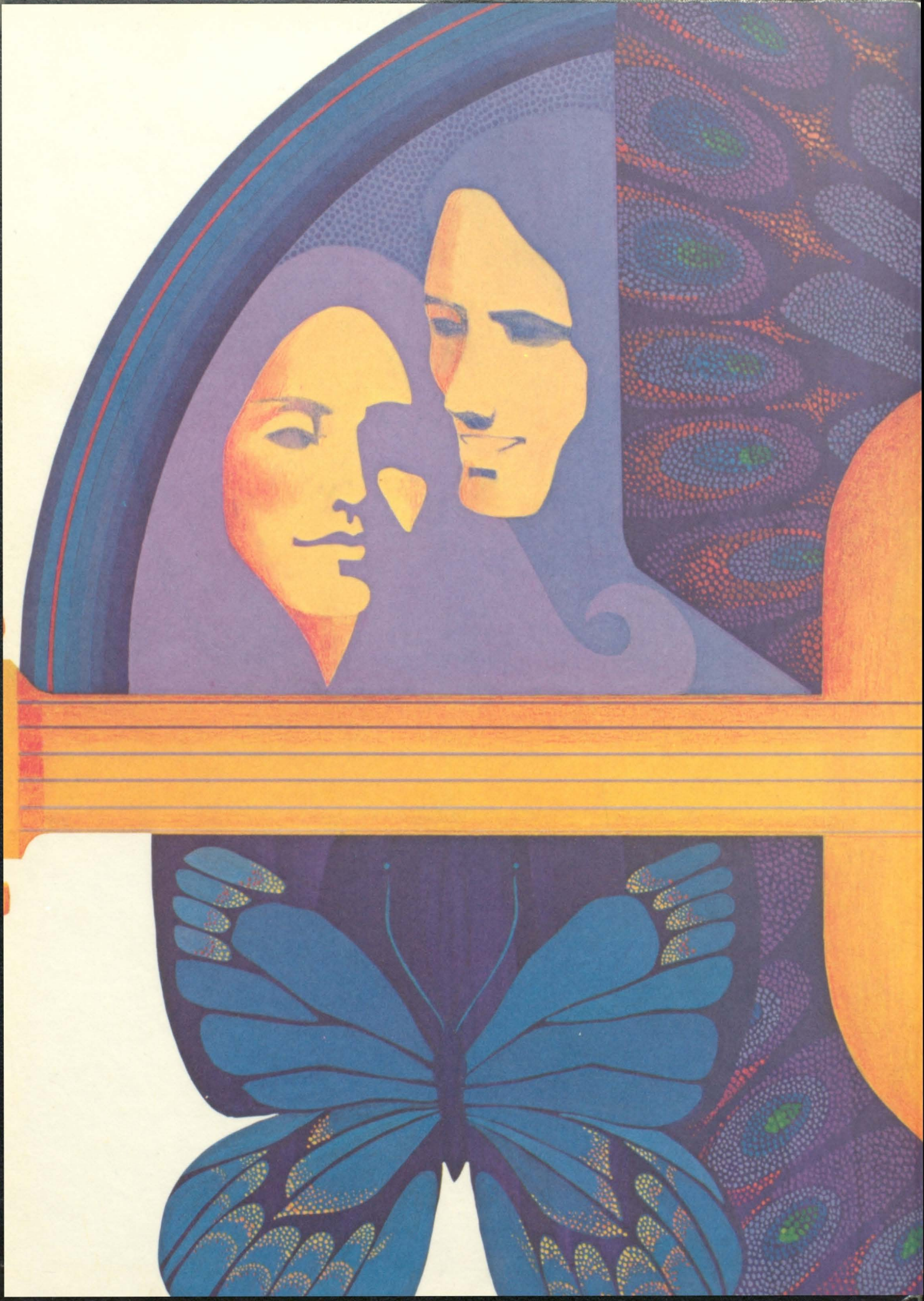

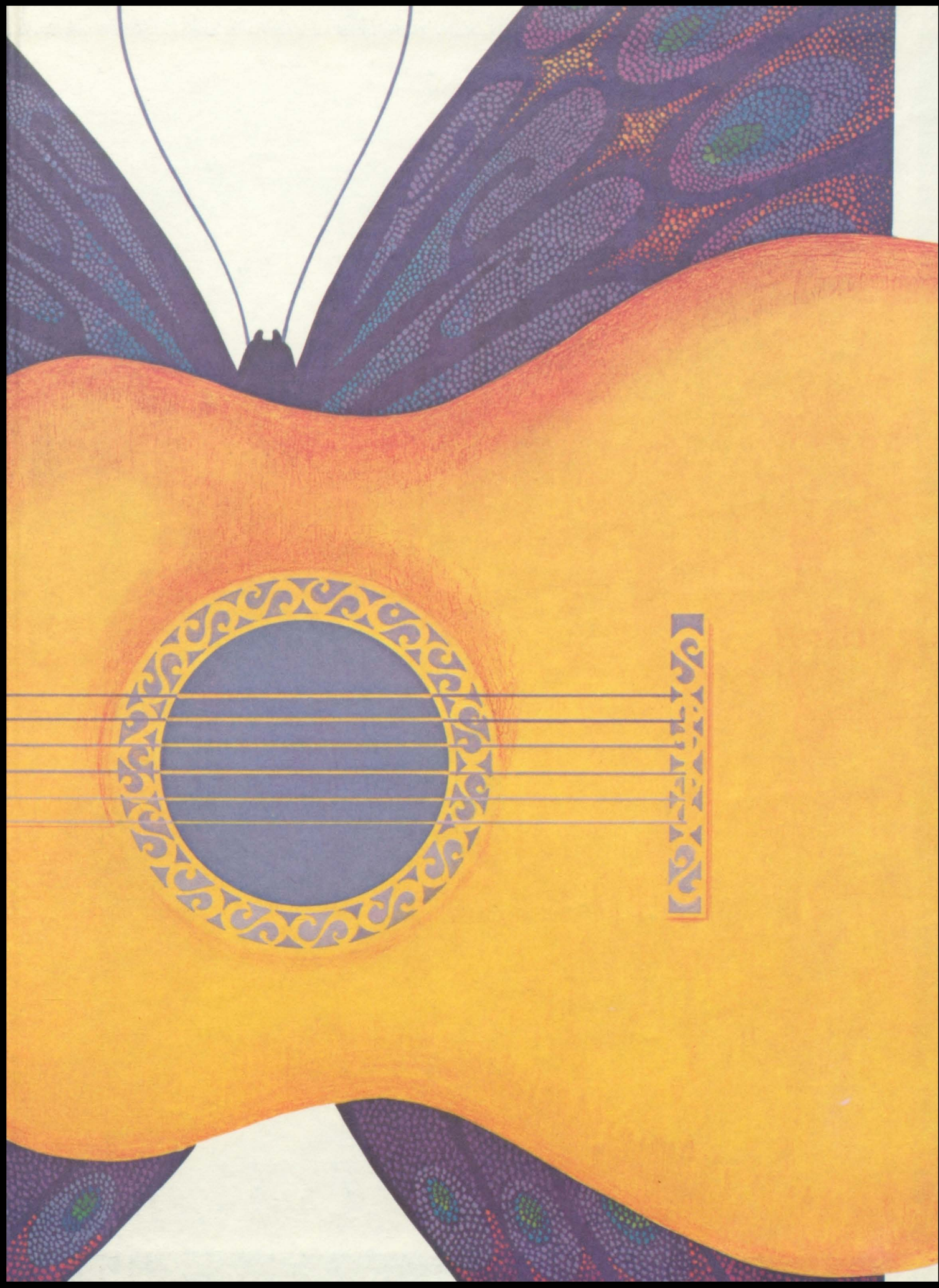

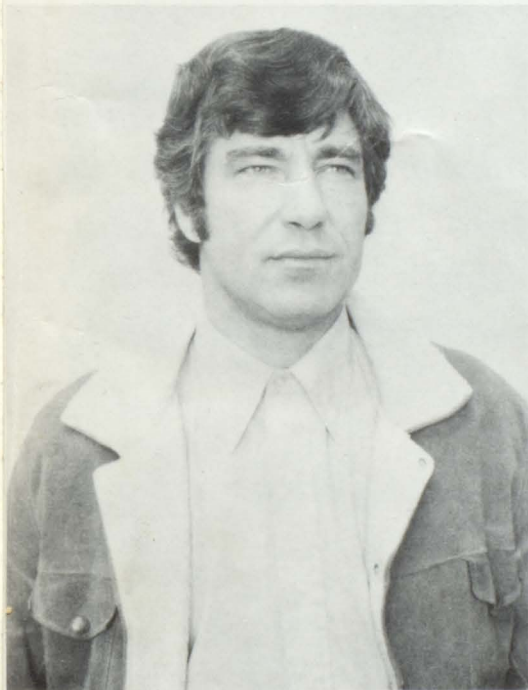






## Dedications

Hayden Tigers not only have brawn but also have brains. We have Tigers in Forensic, Band, Choir, Chess Club, Spanish Club, and many community organizations.

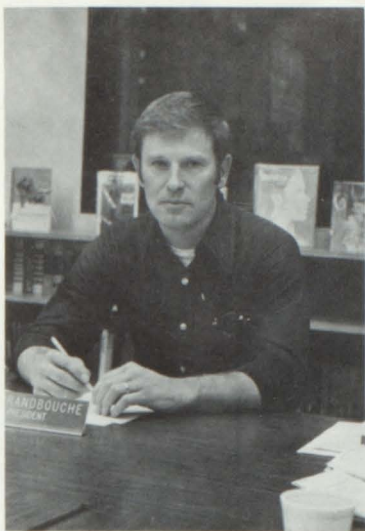

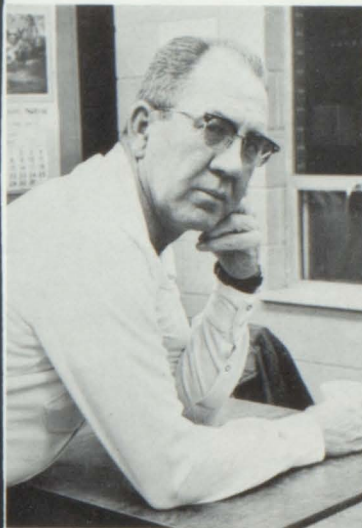

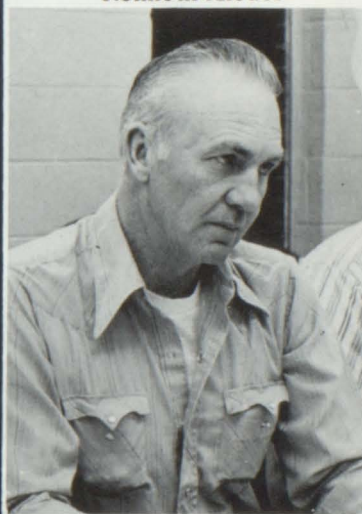
## SCHOOL STAFF

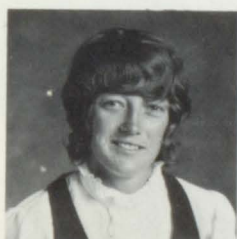
# YEAR OF THE TIGER
