

CATCHIN' UP.....

Looking back on 2022, the Museum had a fairly busy year with a focus on getting back to normal.

We started out the year by contracting with Ratio Design for new construction documents for the Historic Depot Building to deal with remaining issues as outlined in the 2017 Historic Structure Assessment. This project was funded through a State Historic planning grant and a Routt County Museum and Heritage Fund (MAHFAB) grant. These documents will be used to address the historic buildings major issues: updating the electrical (good portion is from 1918!), an aging heating system and some structural and foundation regrading work. This document will enable us to put the work out for bids to ensure the Depot structure remains viable for the Museum collections.

We replaced the Museum's hot water heater with a more efficient on demand system through support from the Town of Hayden and a MAHFAB grant.

Lastly, we were able to concrete the floors in our two storage sheds so that our collection of wagons would be up off the ground thanks to support from Babson Carpenter Foundation and MAHFAB! This issue

Our events started with our annual *Museum Hubbub* in April. This event was started in 2012 as a get together for local Museums to share information and find ways to collaborate. The Hubbub has since morphed into a regional event and the attendees were not only from Routt County but from surrounding counties and southern Wyoming as well!!!

In June we held our biannual fundraiser: The *Elkhead Rock Schoolhouse Tour*. We were fortunate to have as guest speakers authors Dorothy Wickenden (former Executive Editor of the New Yorker) from NYC and Belle Zars (professor and granddaughter of Ferry Carpenter) join us for the event.

We finished the year with our Annual Holiday Stroll seeing over 180 visitors in 1 day!
